Review: God's Multiplication Plan For Your Harvest

After man's fall in the garden, God told Adam in Genesis 3:17 that the ground was cursed and Adam would eat from it with sorrow. Sorrow means painful and hard labor. This was not God's plan. God's plan was for man to be at rest and enjoy God's provision. In the story of Noah, which means rest, we see God's plan for the salvation of mankind. Noah and his family entered into the arc, a picture of being in Christ. Judgment passed over Noah and his family. As they exited the arc, God makes a covenant with Noah in Genesis 8:21-22 saying, "I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake...while the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease." In other words, as long as the sun comes up every morning, God's covenant is in place. When you plant a seed, you can expect a harvest. In addition, every seed produces after it's kind. If you plant corn, you will reap a harvest of corn. If you plant barley, you will reap a harvest of barley.

In the New Covenant, scripture shows us we can plant spiritual seeds, as well as physical seeds. This is God's multiplication plan for your harvest. The parable of the sower in Luke 8 explains that God's words are spiritual seeds and our hearts are the soil. If we plant God's promises in our hearts, we will surely reap a harvest. Romans 10:9-10 tells us "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." God does not want us to painfully labor to enjoy all of His blessings. He wants us to enter into Jesus and enjoy all of the blessings that Jesus purchased for us. When we believe in our heart that we are righteous because of Jesus, and confess it with our mouth, those spiritual seeds produce an amazing harvest. Salvation is a complete package. Strong's Concordance tells us salvation includes welfare, prosperity, deliverance, preservation, salvation and safety. Jesus took all of our punishment that we deserved, and has freely given us a life we could never deserve. The more you meditate and plant God's amazing promises in your heart, the more harvest of blessings you will experience.

In 2 Corinthians 9, scripture also shows that when we give willingly to God, our financial seeds will produce a harvest of blessings. 2 Corinthians 9:6-8 says, "He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. *So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work.*" You can be sure that when you sow financial seeds, all of "God's grace abounds towards you." You will not only have enough for yourself, you will have enough to continue to sow more seeds and be a blessing to others.
